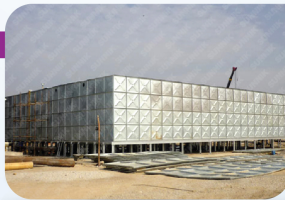

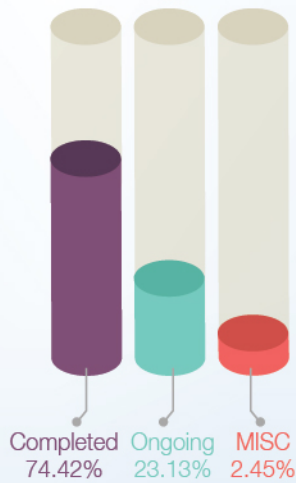

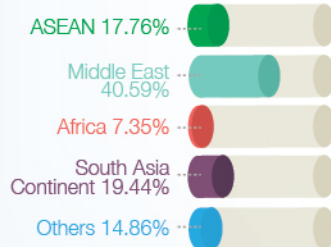

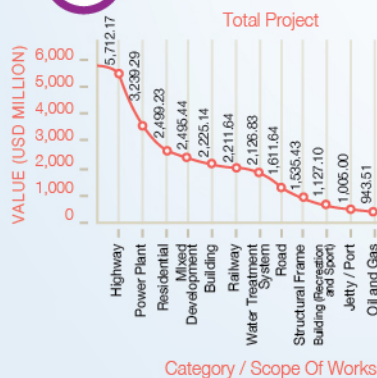

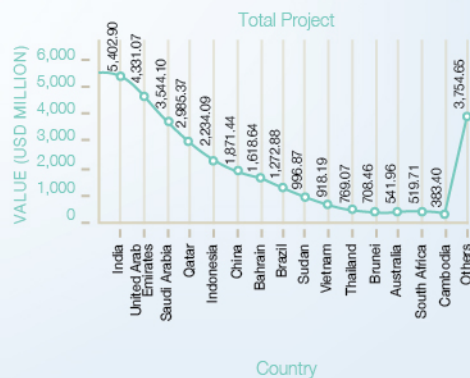


Overseas Project By Region (USD Million)
