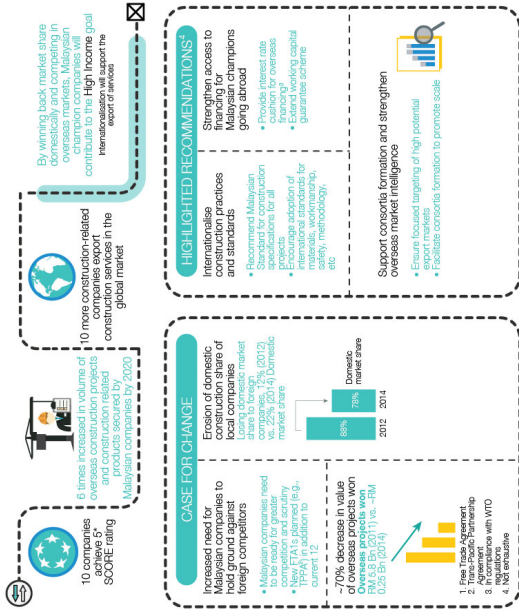


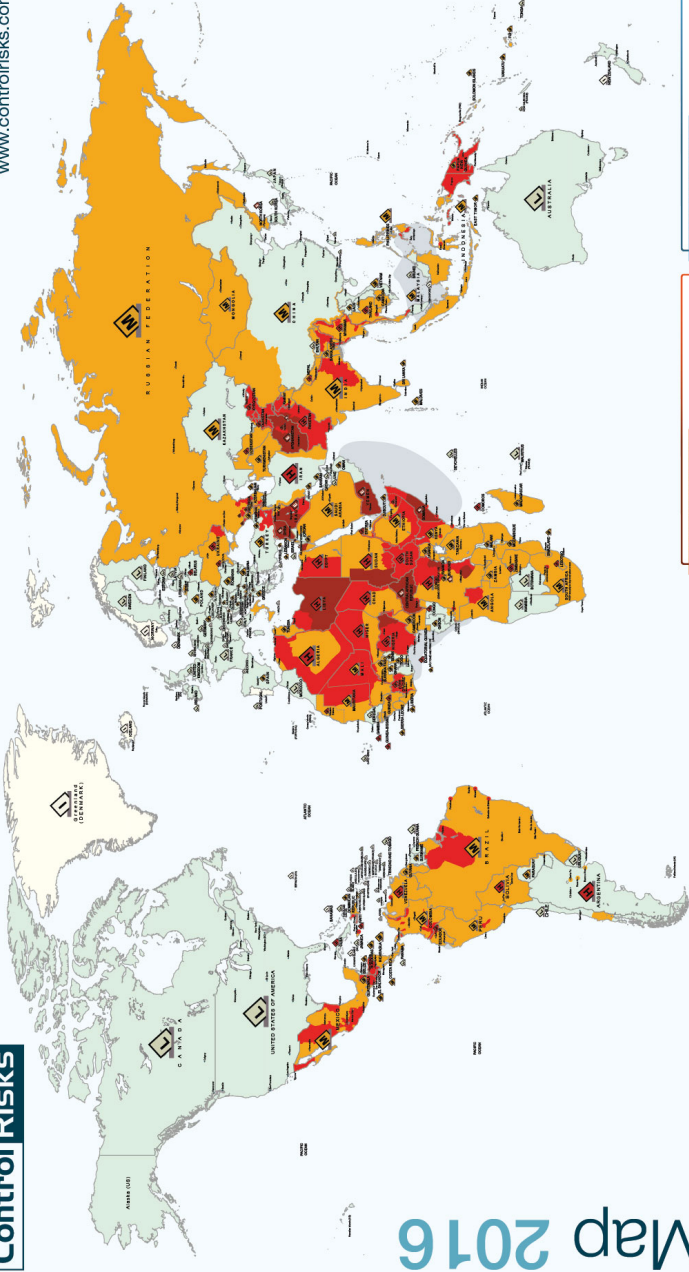

Introduction

The Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) under the Ministry of Works, Malaysia was established in 1994 under the Construction Industry Development Act (Act 520) to develop, coordinate and regulate the construction industry, ensuring the industry's competitiveness.

To develop the Malaysian Construction Industry

Vision

To be a leader in developing a World Class Construction Industry

Objective

The overall objective of CIDB is to enhance the capacity and capability of the Construction Industry through the enhancement of the industry's performance by placing great emphasis on professionalism, innovation and knowledge sharing to improve the quality of life.

Functions

Functions of the Board as laid down under subsection 4 (1) of Act 520 are as follows:

1. To promote and stimulate the development, improvement and expansion of the construction industry;
2. To advise and make recommendations to the Government on matters related to the construction industry;
3. To conduct research and undertake research in matters relating to the construction industry;
4. To promote, stimulate and assist in the export of services relating to the construction industry;
5. To provide consultancy and advisory services with respect to the construction industry;
6. To coordinate and monitor the construction industry information systems;
7. To initiate and maintain the construction industry information systems;
8. To encourage the standardization and improvement of construction techniques and materials;
9. To provide, promote, review and coordinate training programmes organized by the public and private sectors for the construction industry;
10. To accredit and regulate contractor organisations including to cancel, suspend or reissue the registration of any registered contractor; and
11. To accredit and certify skilled construction workers and construction site supervisors.

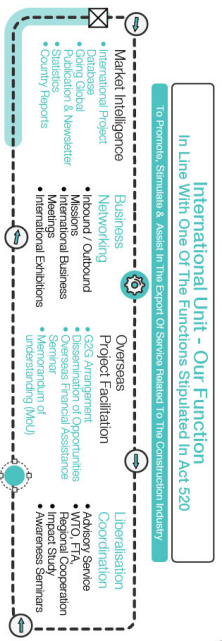

An overview of the CIDB International Project Database



CIDB's International Unit has initiated the CIDB International Project Database, a web-based information system that provides information on current and completed overseas projects by Malaysian contractors. The recently commissioned information system is poised to support one of CIDB's pinnacle functions, which is to promote, stimulate and assist in the export of services related to the construction industry.

The CIDB International Project Database is accessible to everyone via the CIDB official website at www.cidb.gov.my or at <http://international.cidb.gov.my/international/> where the application is being hosted. Reports of any construction activities overseas are submitted online, directly into the system by industry players. Data submissions are made on a voluntary basis and closely monitored by CIDB's International Unit.

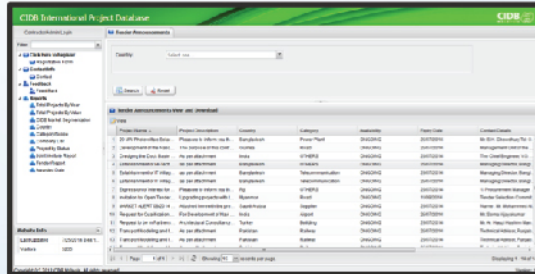


As the main function of the CIDB International Project Database is to facilitate the public in gaining in-depth information related to overseas construction projects, it therefore provides users the necessary ability to perform data mining by querying project details and summary, as well as monitoring the statuses of overseas projects.

The CIDB International Project Database will be used by various ministries and government agencies such as the Ministry of Works, the Ministry of International Trade and Investment, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Bank Negara Malaysia. Academicians and students (especially those embarking on Construction Management research) can also benefit greatly from the system as it provides various types of first-hand information to assist them in understanding the portfolio, capabilities and reaches of Malaysian contractors all over the world.

International Registered Contractor (IRC)



Introduction

International Registered Contractor (IRC) category was introduced in CIDB registration system in 2006, which seeks to identify the official list of construction companies competent to handle projects and services internationally.

As part of CIDB's initiative to encourage Malaysian contractors to venture into the global market, we are registering contractors with the right criteria to be the CIDB International Registered Contractor. Selected contractors who fulfill the specified criteria will be included into this listing.

Application for Registration as International Registered Contractor (IRC)

Application

A firm or local company or a company incorporated in Malaysia or an existing firm or company which is involved in construction activities may apply for registration using Form CIDB SSPK (1RoC)/2012 and paying a processing fee of RM30.00.

Conditions for Application

Registration Criteria

- a. Registered with CIDB for not less than 3 years
- b. Proven track record in at least one completed project either local or overseas in the related field
- c. ISO 9001:2008 Certification
- d. Active classification status

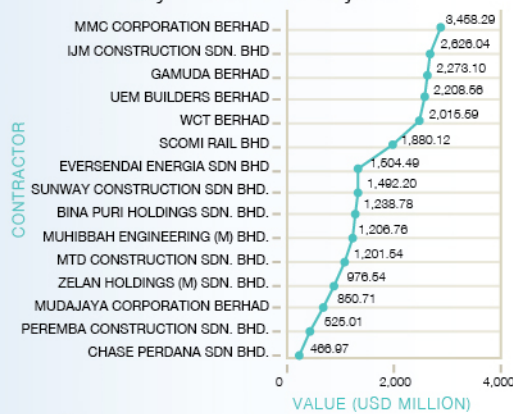

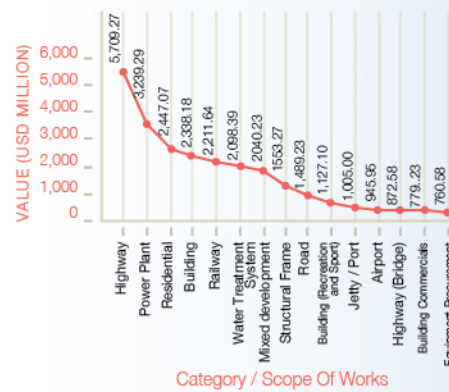

Overseas Project Awarded To Malaysian Contractors By Value of Project



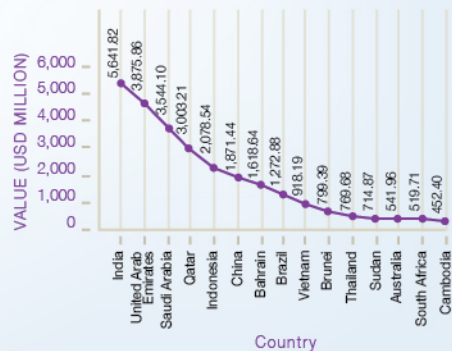
Overseas Project Awarded To Malaysian Contractors By Scope
